Institutional Site License Agreement for JBSD Online

This Institutional License Agreement is entered into the	nis (day) of (1	month) 200, between Aden	ine
Press (hereinafter Adenine Press or Licensor) and		(hereinafter Licensee).	

1. License

The License Agreement between Adenine Press and the Licensee grants the Licensee and its Authorized Users (herein after defined) a non-exclusive, non-transferable, license to search, retrieve, save, download, email and printout copies of individual articles or other items from the data base of the Journal of Biomolecular Structure & Dynamics (herein after JBSD Online, accessible at www.jbsdonline.com), according to the terms and conditions set forth in this Agreement. Adenine Press warrants that it has all rights necessary to enter into this Agreement and to make JBSD Online available to Licensee and its Authorized Users in accordance with the terms of this Agreement.

2. Licensee

Licensee is defined as an educational, research or corporate entity within a local geographical location. For example, SUNY at Albany, uptown and down town campus constitute "one" geographical location. However, SUNY at Albany, SUNY at Buffalo, SUNY at Stony Brook and SUNY at Binghamton are separate geographical locations, and each need separate licenses, and separate print subscriptions to qualify for JBSD Online access.

3. Active Subscription to the Print Version of JBSD is Required

The Licensee must have an active subscription to the print version of the JBSD at the full institutional rate to qualify for a site License for JBSD Online. In addition, the Licensee must pay the prevalent license fee to become an Authorized Site.

4. Authorized Site and Authorized User

An Authorized Site is simply the location where an Authorized User is, irrespective of whether on campus, or home or away on travel for a conference. Authorized users are those individuals officially affiliated with the Licensee (see definition in 2 above) such as employees, faculty, students, visiting scientists and other visitors to the institution.

5. Access by an Authorized User

Authorized User while on campus will access JBSD Online automatically because the IP addresses provided by the Licensee will be automatically recognized by the servers of JBSD Online. While away from campus, authorized users can login to their library and access JBSD Online.

6. What Authorized Users are Allowed to Do.

For scholarly, educational, research or personal use any Authorized User may search, retrieve, save, download, email and print out copies of individual articles or other items from JBSD Online. An Authorized user may display and/or link JBSD Online with educational programs such as WebCT for class room instruction.

Any Authorized User may make multiple copies of materials in JBSD Online for free distribution to students in a course. An acknowledgement like the following should appear in such materials: Reprinted with permission from: Journal of Biomolecular Structure & Dynamics (year of publication) © Adenine Press.

7. What Authorized Users are Not Allowed to Do.

Entire issues of the Journal should not be downloaded.

Items from the data base should not be copied and distributed for fees

Material from the data base should not be manipulated in way to prepare derivative work without written consent of Adenine Press.

Copyright notices included in any part of the database should not be altered, removed or modified in any way.

8. Interlibrary Loans

Interlibrary loans are limited only to the print version. The Licensee is not allowed to allow access to JBSD Online by other libraries

9. Unauthorized Use

An institution will not be held liable to Adenine Press for unauthorized use of JBSD Online provided such use is without the consent of the institution. If the institution becomes aware of any unauthorized use of JBSD Online, it will promptly notify Adenine Press, and take all reasonable steps to prevent such activities.

10. Disclaimers

The information present in JBSD Online may not be identical to what is in the corresponding print version.

JBSD Online should not be considered a substitute for the print version. JBSD Online is offered simply as a great convenience and neat vehicle for faculty, students and researchers to access information rapidly irrespective of wherever they are geographically.

Adenine Press will have no liability to any person for any loss or damage arising out of use of, or inability to use, JBSD Online.

Adenine press shall make all reasonable efforts to make its server available to Authorized Users on a 24 hour basis, except for the down time for normal site maintenance. If access is suspended or interrupted, due to circumstances beyond Adenine's control, the liability shall be limited to restoring access as soon as possible.

Adenine Press reserves the right to modify the terms of this agreement at any time by providing notice to institutions. Continued use of JBSD Online for more than 30 days after such notice shall constitute acceptance of such modifications.

11. Termination of License

Adenine Press may terminate this license for JBSD Online for any breach of this agreement, by providing a notice to the institution. No refund will be provided upon such termination.

12. Term of Agreement

This agreement will remain active as long as the Licensee has an active subscription for the print version of JBSD and has paid the license fee.
